The University has been accredited with 'A' Grade in the second cycle of NAAC assessment and accreditation conducted in August 2023. The University has been listed among the top 150-200 Universities in NIRF ranking. The University is fully funded by the University Grants Commission (UGC). Permanent Campus of the University is situated in 484 acres of land at Jant-Pali Villages, Mahendergarh district of Haryana from where CUH is running its academic operations. Presently the University offers 86 academic programmes (UG/PG/Research).

Since then, the Department of History and Archaeology has been growing steadily focusing on numerous areas of history from pre-historic period to the contemporary India.
