Proposal for availing funds from Higher Education Funding Agency (HEFA) for creation of capital assets/ capital expenditure during the project period from financial year 2018-19 to 2020-21

The Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), vide its letter bearing F.No. 16-2/2017-TC dated 16.07.2018 (Annexure-A) has intimated that "Revitalising Infrastructure and Systems in Education (RISE) by 2022 has been approved by Government of India on 4th July, 2018 by suitably extending/ modifying the existing financing norms of Higher Education Funding Agency (HEFA) to accommodate the infrastructure needs and financial capability of several categories of institutions, under higher education, school education and institutions under the Ministry of Health".

In accordance with revised norms for financing by HEFA, Requirement of funds amounting to **Rs. 434.63 Crore (Annexure-B)** for creation of capital assets/ capital expenditure during the project period from financial year 2018-19 to 2020-21 has been prepared, keeping in view following factors:

1. Adherence of Priority List & Negative List of Works:

All ongoing as well as proposed projects/ activities for which funds are being sought from HEFA pertain to Priority List of works and no project/ activity pertains to Negative List of works.

2. Student Strength Projection for Next Five Years:

Student strength for the period upto 2023-24 has been estimated by assuming that all sanctioned seats of current under graduate as well as post graduate programmes will be filled up from 2019-20 onwards and research scholars would increase with recruitment of regular faculty. Year-wise student strength projection is as below:

4. Loan Repayment Capability:

As per new RISE by 2022 model, Central University of Haryana comes under category of "Central Universities started prior to 2014". Accordingly, the University is required to Repay 10% of the principal loan from internal resources, and receive grant for the balance of the principal portion. Further, the University is required to repay the outstanding principal amount after a period of three (03) years from the date of completion of project period. As the project period is from financial year 2018-19 to 2020-21, therefore the University is required to repay Rs 43.46 Crore, i.e., 10% of total project cost of Rs 434.63 Crore during financial year 2023-24. The University is capable of repaying this amount of Rs 43.46 Crore from total estimated Internal Receipts of Rs 46.72 Crore for the period from financial year 2018-19 to 2023-24 as estimated below:

Subject: Availing finance from Higher Education Funding Agency (HEFA).

Sir/Madam,

"Revitalising Infrastructure and Systems in Education (RISE) by 2022 has been approved by Government of India on 4th July, 2018 by suitably extending/modifying the existing financing norms of Higher Education Financing Agency (HEFA) to accommodate the infrastructure needs and financial capability of several categories of institutions under higher education, school education and institutions under the Ministry of Health.

- 2. As per new RISE by 2022 model, the eligible institutions will be financed under the following five financing windows:
 - i. <u>Technical Institutions more than 10 years old</u>: Repay the whole Principal Portion from the internally generated budgetary resources.
 - ii. Technical Institutions started between 2008 and 2014: Repay 25% of the principal portion from internal resources, and receive grant for the balance of the Principal portion.
 - iii. Central Universities started prior to 2014: Repay 10% of the principal portion from internal resources, and receive grant for the balance of the Principal portion.
 - iv. Newly established Institutions (started after 2014), for funding construction of permanent campuses: Grant would be provided for complete servicing of loan through OH-31. Other Institutions of MHRD with no scope for fee revision or internal resource generation would also figure in this category.

- v. Other educational institutions and grant-in-aid institutions of Ministry of Health: Sponsoring Department/Ministry to give a commitment for complete servicing of the principal and interest by ensuring adequate funds in the OH-31 for the institution.
- 3. The broad guidelines for appraisal of infrastructure projects in CFIs consisting of Priority List (Annexure-I) and Negative List of works (Annexure-II) are also enclosed herewith.
- 4. Further, it has also been decided that the institutions in windows II / III/ IV will have to improve their internal generation and shall repay the outstanding principal amount after a period of 2/3/5 years respectively from the date of completion of the project period. MHRD will assess the performance of each institution on a continuing basis fix a period beyond which servicing of interest shall also be taken over by the institution in part or full.

However, considering the limited possibility of generation of internal revenues by some institutions, it is decided that the above provisions would be made applicable only after due joint review by the Department of Higher Education and the Department of Expenditure.

5. It is hereby informed and requested that proposal(s) for financing from HEFA are formulated and firmed up with the approval of Finance Committee (FC) and Board of Governor (BOG)/ Executive Council (EC) (as applicable) in accordance with above revised norms of financing by HEFA, with all supporting documents expeditiously. The same may be submitted for HEFA financing through the concerned Department/Ministry.

Sub: Broad guidelines for appraisal of infrastructure projects in CFIs

The following would be the broad guidelines for appraisal of infrastructure projects for CFIs. These guidelines would be used for appraisal of all new projects which would be posed to the Ministry for appraisal.

- i) Only the works in the priority list (Annexure-I) would be funded. In case any additional area is to be constructed, the same has to be adequately justified.
- ii) The works in the negative list (Annexure-II) would not be funded. If any work under these categories are already sanctioned/started, no further funding shall be released on these works, except that which is needed to bring the work to safe stage and close. Of course, the institution can mobilise funds from other sources for their completion.
- iii) The infrastructure entitlements will be for the student strength as per the sanctioned project.
- iv) In the new institutions, the land shall be developed in parcels of 50 Acres each, with utilities like roads, sewage, garbage disposal system, water facilities etc. Only after full utilisation of this 50 acres, can another parcel of 50 acres be started for land development. The development shall therefore be confined to that part of the land (only) which is functionally required to serve the student strength for the next 5 years.

2. Land Development:

To be done in modules of 50 Acres.

3. Connectivity:

Atleast 1 Gbps speed internet facility, with fibre optic cable connecting all the buildings, LAN and equipment, including Wi-Fi facility covering all hostels, academic blocks and administrative building.

4. Smart classrooms:

All classroom shall be smart classroom as per the specifications of the ODB Expert Committee.

5. Self sustained projects:

Projects which are able to mobilise funds for their construction and maintenance, like research parks.

- 1. Any work in excess of the limits prescribed in the Priority list.
- 2. Swimming Pools.
- 3. Shopping Complexes
- 4. Eatery/Food Courts
- 5. Stadium

- 7. Ring Road in the entire campus
- 8. Construction of Director/Faculty/Staff quarters in excess to the entitlement as per CPWD norms.
- 9. Guest House with more than (20) Rooms.
